- You are the leader
- You must take action

As a professional driver, you are likely to be confronted by some sort of emergency at some point in your career. You need to know the steps to take to ensure the safety of those involved.

Seven Basic Emergency Management Steps

A prepared and appropriate response to an emergency situation will keep both you and your passengers safe.

- 1. Protect yourself
- 2. Remain calm
- 3. Assess the situation
- 4. Protect your passengers, reassure them and offer them help
- 5. Call dispatch, request help
- 6. Secure the scene
- 7. Gather information
